President's Message Honoring a Role Model and a Legal Legend

I'm sure that everyone can recount role models who made an impression on them at some point in their lives. The impression could be big or small, personal or professional or for any number of reasons. The same is true for me. Besides my parents, there was my grandmother (mentioned in a previous column), my calculus teacher, and my high school soccer coach, among others, making an impression in their own ways. At every stage of life, someone or several have stuck out.

When I became a lawyer and joined the Bar Association of Baltimore City, it was no different. I shouldn't have been surprised as there is a long history of wonderful individuals and great bar leaders who take the time to help out others. At the risk of inadvertently leaving someone out, I won't name all of those who made an impression on me since becoming a lawyer, albeit with one exceptional exception.

That individual is Judge Joseph H.H. Kaplan. You are likely already familiar with Judge Kaplan, since over the years he has touched the lives of so many. Born in Brooklyn, New York, he graduated from Johns Hopkins University in 1957 and the University of Chicago Law School in 1960. He clerked for Chief Judge Frederick W. Brune for the Maryland Court of Appeals and became a member of the Maryland Bar in 1961. He served honorably in the U.S. Army, U.S. Army National Guard, Air Force Reserve, and U.S. Naval Reserve. He was also an Assistant U.S. Attorney, a partner at Venable, and served in other Baltimore City and community civil

service positions, which are too numerous to name. He was appointed to the Baltimore City bench in January 1977. He served with distinction until his mandatory retirement in October of 2006. During that stretch he served as both the Administrative and Chief Judges. Judge Kaplan spent a large part of his time resolving the Savings and Loan crisis and addressing the asbestos case crunch. He proudly reminds us that he was the last of the Baltimore City Circuit Court judges who also served on the "Supreme Bench" before the name was changed. Judge Kaplan was also the President of the Library Company of the Baltimore Bar and a Trustee of the Baltimore Bar Foundation.

I didn't know Judge Kaplan in those earlier years. However, I remember meeting him at the very first city bar event I ever attended. I spoke with him briefly. His reputation had preceded him. While I knew who he was, I was sure he would not remember me. Flash forward a week later, when I attended a BABC networking event at Peter's Pub on Water Street. I saw Judge Kaplan and was surprised when he greeted me by name and continued the topic of conversation from a week earlier. That is a moment I vividly remember to this day. It astounded me that I was important enough to him to remember. I quickly learned that that's just who he is, and he participated in everything and made everyone feel welcome and special. At one point, he encouraged me to continue my involvement with the BABC, and I stuck with it. I hope I have lived up to his expectations.

Throughout my years with the BABC, Judge Kaplan has continued to be a mainstay. He was never a President of the BABC, but he has essentially been the godfather of the bench, bar, the Bar Association of

Judge Kaplan has received many awards over the years recognizing his service and achievements, including a Distinguished Citizen Certificate from the Maryland Governor and a Baltimore City Mayor's Citation in 1971. He also served on many judicial committees and boards, and in many roles with the Bar Association of Baltimore City and the Maryland State Bar Association. Perhaps his most proud accomplishment, however, has been his marriage to his wonderful wife, Joy. Befitting his stature and reputation within the Baltimore City legal community, Judge Kaplan was honored in 2011 by the Bar Association of Baltimore City as a "Baltimore City Living Legal Legend" in a ceremony and reception attended by more than 600 people.

Judge Kaplan is truly a living, legal legend. The Baltimore Courthouse and

Law Museum Foundation is now seeking to keep Judge Kaplan's likeness in the Baltimore City court system for years and years to come by honoring him with an official portrait.
