President's Message

Patriotism

When I sat down to write this month, I considered following up on one of my first columns concerning the need for a new courthouse. While a discussion of the recent power outage in Court-house East and talk about an apparent bedbug infestation would have provided even more outrageous material sure to push for change, thinking about bedbugs tends to make people feel itchy. I decided not to do that to you. Instead, I chose to focus on something that should be more uplifting—patriotism. Please forgive the fact that I decided not to wait until the last minute to write this either, which may make it a little dated.

Nevertheless, patriotism is defined as an emotional attachment to a nation which an individual recognizes as his or her homeland. It's a sense of pride, at least from my perspective, in being an American. Of course we celebrate the 4th of July, as well as Memorial Day and Veterans Day, each year as an homage to our country and the men and women who served so proudly to earn our freedom. We often robotically sing the national anthem and God Bless America at sporting events and recite the pledge of allegiance in schools. At a time when our nation and our city have experienced a lot of growing pains, however, I was reminded of what it truly means to be an American over the weekend, when I attended Fleet Week activities in Baltimore. While suffering through endless media attention of alleged role models making their own personal national anthem protests and decrying how bad life is when you're making millions of dollars, we sometimes forget about those who have dedicated their lives to our country in the military and who should be the true role models. That was on full celebratory display in our great city this weekend, in a mutually symbiotic relationship.

I first experienced Fleet Week while my 7 year old and I were heading towards the Ft. McHenry tunnel on our way to the NS Savannah docked at Canton Marine Terminal 13 to speak by video link with other Boy Scouts around the world. In a scene reminiscent of Maverick "buzzing the tower"

in Top Gun, albeit without the tower or Kelly McGillis, a Navy Blue Angels jet loudly catapulted past the car on its way to a steep vertical climb and loop maneuver that would've made "Goose" proud. My wingman, Will, marveled at the smoke coming out of the back of the jets and how they could possibly manage to "be that close" and avoid each other on a subsequent move. Unfortunately, we only caught the tail end of the show, but suffice it to say, I didn't think he would ever stop talking about seeing the Blue Angels.

When we finally got to the Savannah, we snuck away and started a self-guided tour of the mammoth ship, which was the first nuclear powered merchant ship built in the late 1950's. We happened to find the ship's engine room and control center full of switches, buttons and gauges. After first convincing Will that he probably shouldn't "mess with the buttons," I deferred to a navy nuclear engineer also in the room. He explained how the radioactive fuel rods used to be carefully positioned for the full effect of fission to occur, thereby powering the ship.

Appearing unfazed and inquisitive, and staring at one of the gauges, my son asked if that meant the boat had enough "gas in the tank." The seaman didn't have to stay there with us, but took his time explaining complex science to a kid (Will, not me) who was clearly intrigued even if he probably didn't quite understand. My son and his friends left the ship having learned some exciting things and feeling good about Baltimore and our country's history. That's the message we should want to send.

We capped off our day by walking in the Inner Harbor amongst several other docked U.S. Navy ships and the U.S.S. Constellation, in an atmosphere clearly abuzz with patriotic Americans proud to participate. Suffice it to say, my son (and I) had a great time. He came away from the experience feeling proud to be a part of Baltimore and our country's traditions, including Fleet Week.

In closing, I have a couple of requests. Please exercise your First Amendment rights and fight for what you believe in. At the same time, however, please do not forget the true meaning of patriotism and what it means to be an American. We are all Americans and one must not lose sight of those true heroes and role models among us, including our military.

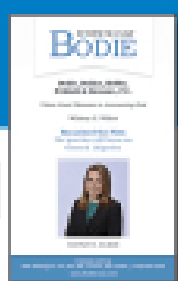
