Thankful for the Rule of Law

elections in our lifetime. A lot is at stake, both locally and nationally. And while there may be congressional power shifts and an occupancy change at the White House, one thing will remain the same and that is the role that the Rule of Law will continue to play regardless of the outcome of the

Tuesday, election.

The Rule of Law has allowed societal norms to be established and maintained if citizens continue to agree that it is important to follow the rules and if the rules have not become impossible to follow. At times, the Rule of Law can be predictable and at other times the Rule of Law can be unfair. But it is unfathomable to contemplate a society without the order and precedence which is the byproduct of the Rule of Law.

According to the American Bar Association, in 2007, ABA President William Neukom established the World Justice Project. The World Justice Project recognizes the problem that "the 'rule of law' is a frequently used term that is rarely defined." The World Justice Project has proposed a

working definition of the rule of law that comprises four principles:

- 1.A system of self-government in which all persons, including the government, are accountable under the law
- 2. A system based on fair, publicized, broadly understood and stable laws
- 3.A fair, robust, and accessible legal process in which rights and responsibilities based in law are evenly enforced
- 4. Diverse, competent, and independent lawyers and judges

Considering the guiding principles of the Rule of Law, on Thanksgiving as we are gathering with family and friends to give thanks, let us not forget to be thankful for the Rule of Law. Be thankful that despite our societal challenges, we still live in a civil

society where all persons are to be held accountable under the law. This is not to say that accountability is always swift or equitable, but we still must be thankful that there is a system in place. Let us be thankful for a system that is fundamentally clear, available for scrutiny by all and while it is a system that may sometimes be slow to change. the pace at which change does occur allows for the system to remain stable. Be thankful for a system that can be a means of strength and power for the marginalized members of our society. And, finally, let us all be thankful for being members of a profession which is on the front-line as the first defenders of the Rule of Law which remains the bedrock of our democracy.


